# A BILL

- To establish a comprehensive United States Government initiative to build the capacity of young leaders and entrepreneurs in Africa, and for other purposes.
  - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

#### **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Young African Leaders
- 5 Initiative Act of 2021" or the "YALI Act of 2021".

#### 6 SEC. 2. SENSE OF CONGRESS.

7 It is the sense of Congress that—

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(1) the Young African Leaders Initiative,
 launched in 2010, is a signature effort to invest in
 the next generation of African leaders;

4 (2) Africa is a continent of strategic importance
5 and it is vital for the United States to support
6 strong and enduring partnerships with the next gen7 eration of African leaders; and

8 (3)the United States Government should 9 prioritize investments to build the capacity of young 10 emerging African leaders in sub-Saharan Africa, in-11 cluding through efforts to enhance leadership skills, 12 encourage entrepreneurship, strengthen public ad-13 ministration and the role of civil society, and connect 14 young African leaders continentally and globally 15 across the private, civic, and public sectors.

### 16 SEC. 3. YOUNG AFRICAN LEADERS INITIATIVE PROGRAM.

17 (a) IN GENERAL.—There is established in the De18 partment of State the Young African Leaders Initiative
19 ("YALI") program.

(b) DUTIES.—The YALI program shall seek to build
to capacity of young African leaders in sub-Saharan Africa
in the areas of civic engagement, entrepreneurship and
business development, including through efforts to—

(1) support young African leaders by offeringprofessional development and a global network to

share expertise, including in the areas of civic lead ership, elections, human rights, good governance and
 public management;

4 (2) provide increased economic and technical
5 assistance to young African leaders and entre6 preneurs, to strengthen ties between United States
7 and African businesses.

8 (c) FELLOWSHIPS.—The YALI program shall award 9 Mandela Washington Fellowships to young leaders who 10 have demonstrated strong capabilities in entrepreneurship, 11 innovation, public service, and leadership, and who have 12 had a positive impact in their communities, organizations, 13 or institutions.

14 (d) REGIONAL LEADERSHIP CENTERS.—The YALI 15 program shall offer training to young leaders who have 16 demonstrated strong capabilities in entrepreneurship, in-17 novation, public service and leadership, and who have had 18 a positive impact in their communities, organizations, or 19 institutions, by seeking to establish regional leadership 20 centers in sub-Saharan Africa.

21 (e) ACTIVITIES.—

(1) UNITED STATES-BASED ACTIVITIES.—The
Secretary of State, in coordination with the Administrator for the United States Agency for International Development, shall oversee all United

States-based activities carried out under the YALI
 program, including the following:

(A) The participation of Mandela Wash-3 4 ington Fellows in a six-week Leadership Institute at a United States university or college in 5 6 business, civic engagement, or public manage-7 ment, including academic sessions, site visits, 8 professional networking opportunities, leader-9 ship training, community service, and organized 10 cultural activities.

(B) The participation by Mandela Washington Fellows in an annual Mandela Washington Fellowship Summit, to provide such Fellows the opportunity to meet with United States
leaders from the private, public, and non-profit
sectors.

17 (2) AFRICA-BASED ACTIVITIES.—The United
18 States should continue to support overseas initiatives
19 of the program, including the following:

20 (A) Quality leadership training, profes21 sional development, and networking opportuni22 ties for Mandela Washington Fellowship alumni
23 upon their return to their home countries, in24 cluding online courses.

1	(B) Training for young African leaders at
2	regional leadership centers established in ac-
3	cordance with subsection (d), and through on-
4	line courses offered by such centers.
5	(C) Opportunities for networking with—
6	(i) alumni of the Mandela Washington
7	Fellowship;
8	(ii) alumni of the programs at YALI
9	Regional Leadership Centers established in
10	accordance with subsection (d), who offer
11	leadership training programs at higher
12	education institutions in sub-Saharan Afri-
13	ca; and
14	(iii) American and African profes-
15	sionals and experts.
16	(D) Opportunities through the United
17	States Africa Development Foundation to facili-
18	tate professional development and sharing of
19	expertise in the home countries of Mandela
20	Washington Fellowship alumni and throughout
21	the African continent.
22	(3) IMPLEMENTATION.—To carry out this sub-
23	section, United States diplomatic and consular posts,
24	the Administrator of the United States Agency for
25	International Development, the Secretary of State,

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1	and agency external partners managing and imple-
2	menting the YALI program—
3	(A) shall promote United States policy

goals in Africa by providing tools and resources to help young African leaders develop important skills and connections, including through online campaigns and public diplomacy initiatives;

8 (B) shall establish a system for moni9 toring, evaluating, and improving the YALI
10 program; and

(C) may accept financial contributions
from foundations, corporations, private donors,
program partners, and implementing agency external partners intended to foster the goals of
the YALI program.

16 (f) REPORTS.—

17 (1) STRATEGY.—The Secretary of State, in co18 ordination with the Administrator of USAID, shall
19 submit to the appropriate congressional committees
20 a strategy for implementing the YALI program, in21 cluding the following:

(A) YALI program goals, targets, and
planned outcomes for each year and, separately,
for the YALI program generally during the duration of its implementation.

1 (B) A YALI program monitoring and eval-2 uation plan, including metrics for measuring 3 YALI program progress and determining 4 whether YALI program goals, targets, and 5 planned outcomes of growing the United States 6 and Africa trade relationship, strengthening 7 civil society and public administration, and sup-8 porting innovation and investment in the next 9 generation of African leaders have been met an-10 nually and, separately, for the YALI program 11 generally, during the duration of its implemen-12 tation. 13 (2)REPORTS.—The Secretary of ANNUAL

14 State, in coordination with the Administrator of 15 USAID, shall submit to the appropriate congres-16 sional committees and publish in a publicly acces-17 sible, Internet-based form, an annual report for the 18 5-year period beginning on the date of the enact-19 ment of this Act on—

20 (A) YALI program progress and an assess21 ment of the metrics, goals, targets, and out22 comes referred to in paragraph (1)(A), includ23 ing information relating to YALI program im24 plementation and outcome activities during the
25 year covered by each report; and

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(B) recommendations for improvements or amendments to the YALI program and strategy, if any, that would improve their effectiveness during subsequent years of YALI program implementation.

6 (3) FINAL REPORT.—Not later than December 7 1, 2025, the Secretary of State, in coordination with 8 the Administrator of USAID, shall submit to the ap-9 propriate congressional committees a final assess-10 ment report that evaluates YALI program imple-11 mentation and outcomes during the entire duration 12 of YALI program operation, including recommenda-13 tions regarding whether the YALI program should 14 be reauthorized and any changes that would improve 15 its effectiveness.

16 (g) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

17 (1) APPROPRIATE CONGRESSIONAL COMMIT18 TEES.—The term "appropriate congressional com19 mittees" means—

20 (A) the Committee on Foreign Affairs of
21 the House of Representatives;
22 (D) the Committee Approximation of the formation of t

(B) the Committee on Appropriations of
the House of Representatives;

24 (C) the Committee on Foreign Relations of25 the Senate; and

1	(D) the Committee on Appropriations of
2	the Senate.
3	(2) Implementing agency external part-
4	NERS.—The term "implementing agency external
5	partners" means any external partner that is not a
6	United States Government agency, and may include
7	one or more of the following entities:
8	(A) Local or multinational corporations.
9	(B) Nongovernmental organizations.
10	(C) Universities.
11	(D) Regional institutions.
