Add at the end of title III the following:

1	SEC. 3 SENSE OF CONGRESS REGARDING PRESS FREE-

3	(a) FINDINGS.—Congress finds that the People's Re-
4	public of China maintains one of the worst media environ-
5	ments in the world and seeks to curtail political speech
6	inside and outside the country, including by—
7	(1) targeting independent and foreign media in
8	China through systematic harassment including the
9	denial of visas to foreign journalists, imprisonment,
10	the denial of medical care to imprisoned journalists,
11	and curtailing access to legal representation;
12	(2) pervasively monitoring and censoring online
13	and social media content, including through the ban-
14	ning of virtual private networks;
15	(3) using the full force of the State to stifle in-
16	ternal dissent including dissent online, particularly
17	dissent that could lead to political change and con-
18	tent that criticizes China's leaders, however trivial.

3	(4) spreading propaganda to foreign audiences
4	through the United Front Work Department and re-

6	(5) eeking to intimidate American-based jour-

15	(b) Sense of Congress.—It is the sense of Con-
16	gress that—
17	(1) the freedom of the press is an unalienable
18	right that is necessary for citizens to hold their gov-
19	ernment to account;
20	(2) the PRC should cease its repression of jour-
21	nalists, citizen journalists, news organizations; and
22	(3) the PRC should cease the censorship of po-
23	litical satire, including comparisons of Xi Jingping's
24	looks with Winnie the Pooh.
