RESOLUTION

- Calling for the immediate release of Evan Gershkovich, a United States citizen and journalist, who was wrongfully detained by the Government of the Russian Federation in March 2023.
- Whereas United States citizen Evan Gershkovich is a reporter for the Wall Street Journal;
- Whereas Evan Gershkovich is an accredited reporter, with a history of working in Russia for the Moscow Times, Agence France-Presse, and the Wall Street Journal;
- Whereas Evan Gershkovich is known to his family, friends, and colleagues as someone who is adventurous, curious, and who has an abiding love for Russia and its people;

- Whereas Evan Gershkovich, a trailblazing and intrepid journalist, actively reported on stories across Russia, including the vast wildfires across Siberia, the COVID-19 pandemic, the Russian economy, and the Government of the Russian Federation's unlawful invasion of Ukraine;
- Whereas, on March 29, 2023, Evan Gershkovich was arrested in Yekaterinburg while reporting on behalf of the Wall Street Journal;
- Whereas, on April 7, 2023, the Government of the Russian Federation charged Evan Gershkovich with espionage;
- Whereas the Government of the Russian Federation has failed to publicly provide evidence of Evan Gershkovich's criminal action to credibly render a charge of espionage;
- Whereas the last time an American journalist was detained on allegations of espionage in Russia was in 1986 during the era of the Soviet Union;
- Whereas, on April 10, 2023, Secretary of State Antony Blinken designated Evan Gershkovich wrongfully detained by the Government of the Russian Federation; and
- Whereas, on April 17, 2023, the United States was joined by 46 United Nations Member States in a joint statement expressing deep concern over the detention of Evan Gershkovich by the Government of the Russian Federation: Now, therefore, be it
 - 1 *Resolved*, That the House of Representatives—
- 2 (1) calls on the Government of the Russian
 3 Federation to immediately release Evan
 4 Gershkovich, who has been wrongfully detained since
 5 March 2023;

1 (2) urges all United States executive branch of-2 ficials, including President Joseph R. Biden, Sec-3 retary of State Antony Blinken, and Special Presi-4 dential Envoy for Hostage Affairs Roger D. Carstens, to raise the case of Evan Gershkovich and 5 to press for his immediate release in all interactions 6 7 with the Government of the Russian Federation: 8 (3) urges the Government of the Russian Fed-9 eration to provide full, unfettered, and consistent 10 consular access, in accordance with its international 11 obligations, to Evan Gershkovich while he remains in 12 detention; 13 (4) urges the Government of the Russian Fed-14 eration to respect the human rights of Evan 15 Gershkovich; 16 (5) urges the Government of the Russian Fed-17 eration to respect the rights of accredited journalists 18 to freely and independently report the news without 19 fear of arbitrary detention or reprisal; 20 (6) urges the Government of the Russian Fed-21 eration to desist from detaining, imprisoning, and 22 otherwise seeking to intimidate journalists in order 23 to curtail or censor an independent press; 24 (7) condemns the Government of the Russian 25 Federation's continued use of detentions and pros4

- ecutions of United States citizens and lawful perma nent residents for political purposes;
- 3 (8) calls for the immediate release of Paul
 4 Whelan, who has been wrongfully detained in Russia
 5 since December 2018;
- 6 (9) expresses continued support for all Amer7 ican citizens and lawful permanent residents de8 tained in Russia and abroad, including Marc Fogel,
 9 Vladimir Kara-Murza, and others; and
- 10 (10) expresses sympathy for and solidarity with 11 the families of Evan Gershkovich, Paul Whelan, and 12 all other American citizens and lawful permanent 13 residents detained abroad for the personal hardship 14 experienced as a result of the arrest and detention 15 of their loved ones.
