In 2012, he was elected to the U.S. Congress representing Florida's 3rd Congressional District for the 113th Congress. He served on the Agricultural and Foreign Affairs Committee from 2013-2021. He was Chairman of the Asia-Pacific subcommittee during the 115th Congress, 2016-2018. During his time in Congress Congressman Yoho traveled extensively to the Asia-Pacific region, Africa, Central and South America promoting strong US relationships focusing on trade and national security. Congressman Yoho was honored to be awarded the "Order of the Rising Sun" by Emperor Naruhito, December 2021.

Congressman Yoho was awarded the "Order of the Polar Star" for his strong support of Mongolia from President Battulga, April 2021.

Congressman Yoho was the primary sponsor of the BUILD Act which authorized the development of the US International Development Finance Corporation (DFC). This was the largest reform in US foreign assistance in more than 20 years. The authorization of the BUILD Act replaced the effective but antiquated OPIC, (Overseas Private Investment Corporation). He is quoted as saying, "We should help countries move from aid to trade."

After leaving Congress Congressman Yoho founded Capitol Concepts Consulting, LLC and works with several business development clients and ventures. Congressman Yoho also serves as an indepedent senior policy advisor for different groups primarily engaged in global food and health security issues. Congressman Yoho continues to write articles on foreign policy issues and has had several published in different world media outlets. He also speaks around the country and different countries pertaining to foreign policies.
