

Mr. Norman T. Roule is a geopolitical and energy consultant with over four decades of experience in Middle East issues. Mr. Roule previously served for 34 years in the Central Intelligence Agency, managing numerous programs relating to Iran and the Middle East. He held multiple senior assignments in Washington, as well as over 15 years of experience working overseas. Mr. Roule served as the National Intelligence Manager for Iran (NIM-I) at the Office of the Director of National Intelligence from November 2008 until September 2017. As NIM-I, he was the principal Intelligence Community (IC) official responsible for overseeing national intelligence policy and activities related to Iran and Iran-related issues, including IC engagement on these topics with senior policymakers in the White House, Congress, National Security Council, the Department of State, and the Department of Defense. Mr. Roule received numerous national intelligence awards.

Mr. Roule currently serves as a senior non-resident advisor at Harvard University's Belfer Center Intelligence Project, George Mason University's National Security Institute, the Center for Strategic and International Studies' Warfare, Irregular Threats, and Terrorism Program, the Counter Extremism Project, and United Against Nuclear Iran. He is also an associate fellow of the Middle East Institute. Mr. Roule routinely appears as an analyst on Middle East issues on U.S. and international media.
