

AMENDMENT TO H.R. 5244
OFFERED BY MR. MILLS OF FLORIDA

At the end of subtitle C of title I, add the following:

1 SEC. ____ . SPECIAL ENVOY FOR SPECIAL MISSIONS.

2 (a) ESTABLISHMENT.—There is authorized to be in
3 the Department a Special Envoy for Special Missions
4 (hereinafter referred to as the “Special Envoy”), who shall
5 be appointed by the President, by and with the advice and
6 consent of the Senate, and be responsible to the Assistant
7 Secretary for Special Diplomatic Missions for matters per-
8 taining to urgent diplomatic engagements and crisis de-
9 escalation and response efforts, and such other related du-
10 ties as the Assistant Secretary for Special Diplomatic Mis-
11 sions may from time to time designate.

12 (b) RANK AND STATUS.—The Special Envoy shall
13 have the rank of ambassador.

14 (c) RESPONSIBILITIES.—In addition to the respon-
15 sibilities described under subsection (a), the Special Envoy
16 shall serve as the senior United States Government official
17 responsible for advocating for United States interests and
18 leading diplomatic engagements in strategic and high-risk
19 areas and regions to—

1 (1) advance efforts promoting American inter-
2 ests and protecting national security;

3 (2) coordinating with relevant bureaus and of-
4 fices in the Department of State, the Department of
5 Defense, and all other relevant executive depart-
6 ments and agencies;

7 (3) and other duties as the President and As-
8 sistant Secretary for Diplomatic Missions may from
9 time to time delegate.

10 (d) LIMITATION.—The Special Envoy shall not be a
11 dual-hatted official with other responsibilities within the
12 Department of State or the executive branch.

13 (e) TERMINATION.—This section shall terminate on
14 December 31, 2029.

15 **SEC. ____ . SPECIAL ENVOY FOR PEACE MISSIONS.**

16 (a) ESTABLISHMENT.—There is authorized to be in
17 the Department a Special Envoy for Peace Missions (here-
18 inafter referred to as the “Special Envoy”), who shall be
19 appointed by the President, by and with the advice and
20 consent of the Senate, and responsible to the Assistant
21 Secretary for Special Diplomatic Missions for matters per-
22 taining to American interests in international conflict me-
23 diation and resolution, and such other related duties as
24 the Assistant Secretary for Special Diplomatic Missions
25 may from time to time designate.

1 (b) RANK AND STATUS.—The Special Envoy shall
2 have the rank of ambassador.

3 (c) RESPONSIBILITIES.—In addition to the respon-
4 sibilities described under subsection (a), the Special Envoy
5 shall serve as the senior United States Government official
6 responsible for—

7 (1) advance efforts aimed at ending ongoing
8 conflicts abroad;

9 (2) representing American interests in resolving
10 international conflicts and disputes;

11 (3) promoting peace and international conflict
12 resolution;

13 (4) coordinating with relevant bureaus and of-
14 fices in the Department of State, the Department of
15 Defense, and all other relevant executive depart-
16 ments and agencies;

17 (5) and other duties as the President or the As-
18 sistant Secretary for Special Diplomatic Missions
19 may from time to time delegate.

20 (d) LIMITATION.—The Special Envoy shall not be a
21 dual-hatted official with other responsibilities within the
22 Department of State or the executive branch.

23 (e) TERMINATION.—This section shall terminate on
24 December 31, 2029.

1 **SEC. ____ . SPECIAL ENVOY FOR LATIN AMERICA.**

2 (a) ESTABLISHMENT.—There is authorized to be in
3 the Department a Special Envoy for Latin America (here-
4 inafter referred to as the “Special Envoy”), who shall be
5 appointed by the President, by and with the advice and
6 consent of the Senate, and responsible to the Assistant
7 Secretary for Special Diplomatic Missions for matters per-
8 taining to all international and foreign policy initiatives
9 for Latin America and the Caribbean, and such other re-
10 lated duties as the Assistant Secretary for Special Diplo-
11 matic Missions may from time to time designate.

12 (b) RANK AND STATUS.—The Special Envoy shall
13 have the rank of ambassador.

14 (c) RESPONSIBILITIES.—In addition to the respon-
15 sibilities described under subsection (a), the Special Envoy
16 shall serve as the senior United States Government official
17 responsible for—

18 (1) implementing maximum pressure campaigns
19 against authoritarian regimes in the Western Hemi-
20 sphere;

21 (2) coordinating efforts to combat illegal migra-
22 tion, drug trafficking, and human trafficking;

23 (3) developing economic growth strategies to
24 counter strategic competitors’ influence in the re-
25 gion; and

1 (4) enforcing sanctions to protect American in-
2 terests and promote democratic governance in the
3 region.

4 (d) LIMITATION.—The Special Envoy shall not be a
5 dual-hatted official with other responsibilities within the
6 Department of State or the executive branch.

7 (e) TERMINATION.—This section shall terminate on
8 December 31, 2029.

9 **SEC. ____ . SPECIAL ENVOY FOR THE UNITED KINGDOM.**

10 (a) ESTABLISHMENT.—There is authorized to be in
11 the Department a Special Envoy for the United Kingdom
12 (hereinafter referred to as the “Special Envoy”), who shall
13 be appointed by the President, by and with the advice and
14 consent of the Senate, and responsible to the Assistant
15 Secretary for Special Diplomatic Missions for matters per-
16 taining to the United Kingdom, and such other related
17 duties as the Assistant Secretary for Special Diplomatic
18 Missions may from time to time designate.

19 (b) RANK AND STATUS.—The Special Envoy shall
20 have the rank of ambassador.

21 (c) RESPONSIBILITIES.—In addition to the respon-
22 sibilities described under subsection (a), the Special Envoy
23 shall enhance diplomatic relations between the United
24 States and the United Kingdom, including by promoting

1 bilateral cooperation in the areas of trade, investment, and
2 security.

3 (d) LIMITATION.—The Special Envoy shall not be a
4 dual-hatted official with other responsibilities within the
5 Department of State or the executive branch.

6 (e) TERMINATION.—This section shall terminate on
7 December 31, 2029.

8 **SEC. ____ . SPECIAL ENVOY FOR UKRAINE.**

9 (a) ESTABLISHMENT.—There is authorized to be in
10 the Department a Special Envoy for Ukraine (hereinafter
11 referred to as the “Special Envoy”), who shall be ap-
12 pointed by the President, by and with the advice and con-
13 sent of the Senate, and responsible to the Assistant Sec-
14 retary for Special Diplomatic Missions for matters per-
15 taining to Ukraine, and such other related duties as the
16 Assistant Secretary for Special Diplomatic Missions may
17 from time to time designate.

18 (b) RANK AND STATUS.—The Special Envoy shall
19 have the rank of ambassador.

20 (c) RESPONSIBILITIES.—In addition to the respon-
21 sibilities described under subsection (a), the Special Envoy
22 shall—

23 (1) support efforts to bring about peace in
24 Ukraine; and

1 (2) enhance diplomatic relations between the
2 United States and Ukraine, including through the
3 promotion of private sector development and bilat-
4 eral cooperation.

5 (d) LIMITATION.—The Special Envoy shall not be a
6 dual-hatted official with other responsibilities within the
7 Department of State or the executive branch.

8 (e) TERMINATION.—This section shall terminate on
9 December 31, 2029.

10 **SEC. ____ . SPECIAL ENVOY FOR BEST FUTURE GENERA-**
11 **TIONS.**

12 (a) ESTABLISHMENT.—There is authorized in the
13 Department a Special Envoy for Best Future Generations
14 (hereafter referred to as the “Special Envoy”), who shall
15 be appointed by the President, by and with the advice and
16 consent of the Senate, and responsible to the Assistant
17 Secretary for Special Diplomatic Missions for matters per-
18 taining to all initiatives impacting the well-being of chil-
19 dren both in the United States and globally, and such
20 other related duties as the Assistant Secretary for Special
21 Diplomatic Missions may from time to time designate.

22 (b) RANK AND STATUS.—The Special Envoy shall
23 have the rank of ambassador.

24 (c) RESPONSIBILITIES.—In addition to the respon-
25 sibilities described under subsection (a), the Special Envoy

1 shall serve as the senior United States Government official
2 responsible for—

3 (1) coordinating the United States Govern-
4 ment's efforts to advance the well-being of children;
5 and

6 (2) aligning policy priorities to advance the
7 well-being of children through coordinating with rel-
8 evant regional bureaus and any such bureaus that
9 report to the Under Secretary for Foreign Assist-
10 ance, provided that any such limitations as apply to
11 foreign assistance shall additionally apply to and di-
12 rect the Special Envoy's policy priorities..

13 (d) LIMITATION.—The Special Envoy shall not be a
14 dual-hatted official with other responsibilities within the
15 Department of State or the executive branch.

16 (e) TERMINATION.—This section shall terminate on
17 December 31, 2029.

18 **SEC. ____ . SPECIAL ENVOY FOR GLOBAL PARTNERSHIPS.**

19 (a) ESTABLISHMENT.—There is authorized to be in
20 the Department a Special Envoy for Global Partnerships
21 (hereinafter referred to as the “Special Envoy”), who shall
22 be appointed by the President, by and with the advice and
23 consent of the Senate, and responsible to the Assistant
24 Secretary for Special Diplomatic Missions for matters per-
25 taining to the promotion and facilitation of strategic pub-

1 lic-private partnerships across the Department, and such
2 other related duties as the Assistant Secretary for Special
3 Diplomatic Missions may from time to time designate.

4 (b) RANK AND STATUS.—The Special Envoy shall
5 have the rank of ambassador.

6 (c) RESPONSIBILITIES.—In addition to the respon-
7 sibilities described under subsection (a), the Special Envoy
8 shall—

9 (1) advance national security and foreign policy
10 goals by leveraging the contributions of partners in-
11 cluding State and local governments, academic and
12 research institutions, the private sector, nongovern-
13 mental organizations, and civil society.

14 (2) serve as the conduit for collaboration be-
15 tween the Department of State, the public and pri-
16 vate sectors, and civil society.

17 (3) expand private sector collaboration includ-
18 ing through engagements that advance diplomacy
19 and development priorities.

20 (4) develop and implement multi-stakeholder
21 partnerships to advance foreign policy priorities.

22 (5) promote the use of innovative private sector
23 engagement tools to advance foreign policy priorities.

1 (6) provide training and consulting services to
2 other bureaus and missions on strategies for engag-
3 ing private sector actors.

4 (7) advise senior leadership across the Depart-
5 ment on tools for integrating private sector engage-
6 ment into strategic planning documents.

7 (d) LIMITATION.—The Special Envoy shall not be a
8 dual-hatted official with other responsibilities within the
9 Department of State or the executive branch.

10 (e) TERMINATION.—This section shall terminate on
11 December 31, 2029.

12 **SEC. ____ . SPECIAL ENVOY FOR SYRIA.**

13 (a) ESTABLISHMENT.—There is authorized to be in
14 the Department a Special Envoy for Syria hereinafter re-
15 ferred to as the “Special Envoy”), who shall be appointed
16 by the President, by and with the advice and consent of
17 the Senate, and responsible to the Assistant Secretary for
18 Near Eastern Affairs for matters pertaining to Syria, and
19 such other related duties as the Assistant Secretary for
20 Near Eastern Affairs may from time to time designate.

21 (b) RANK AND STATUS.—The Special Envoy shall
22 have the rank of ambassador.

23 (c) RESPONSIBILITIES.—In addition to the respon-
24 sibilities described under subsection (a), the Special Envoy

1 shall be responsible for advancing United States policy to-
2 ward Syria.

3 (d) LIMITATION.—The Special Envoy shall not be a
4 dual-hatted official with other responsibilities within the
5 Department of State or the executive branch.

6 (e) TERMINATION.—This section shall terminate on
7 December 31, 2029.

8 **SEC. ____ . SPECIAL ENVOY FOR MIDDLE EAST PEACE.**

9 (a) ESTABLISHMENT.—There is authorized to be in
10 the Department a Special Envoy for Middle East Peace
11 (hereinafter referred to as the “Special Envoy”), who shall
12 be appointed by the President, by and with the advice and
13 consent of the Senate, and responsible to the Assistant
14 Secretary for Near Eastern Affairs for matters pertaining
15 to peace and security in the region, and such other related
16 duties as the Assistant Secretary for Near Eastern Affairs
17 may from time to time designate.

18 (b) RANK AND STATUS.—The Special Envoy shall
19 have the rank of ambassador.

20 (c) RESPONSIBILITIES.—In addition to the respon-
21 sibilities described under subsection (a), the Special Envoy
22 shall be responsible for—

23 (1) mediating negotiations between conflicting
24 parties;

1 (2) coordinating international efforts that facili-
2 tate humanitarian aid and promote security and sta-
3 bility; and

4 (3) working towards a lasting political resolu-
5 tion to conflicts in the region.

6 (d) LIMITATION.—The Special Envoy shall not be a
7 dual-hatted official with other responsibilities within the
8 Department of State or the executive branch.

9 (e) TERMINATION.—This section shall terminate on
10 December 31, 2029.

11 **SEC. ____ . SPECIAL ENVOY FOR SOUTH AND CENTRAL**
12 **ASIAN AFFAIRS.**

13 (a) ESTABLISHMENT.—There is authorized to be in
14 the Department a Special Envoy for South and Central
15 Asian Affairs (hereinafter referred to as the “Special
16 Envoy”), who shall be appointed by the President, by and
17 with the advice and consent of the Senate, and responsible
18 to the Assistant Secretary for Special Diplomatic Missions
19 for matters pertaining to South and Central Asian Affairs,
20 and such other related duties as the Assistant Secretary
21 for Special Diplomatic Missions may from time to time
22 designate.

23 (b) RANK AND STATUS.—The Special Envoy shall
24 have the rank of ambassador.

1 (c) LIMITATION.—The Special Envoy shall not be a
2 dual-hatted official with other responsibilities within the
3 Department of State or the executive branch.

4 (d) TERMINATION.—This section shall terminate on
5 December 31, 2029.
