## AMENDMENT TO H.R. 5300 OFFERED BY MR. BERA OF CALIFORNIA

At the appropriate place, insert the following:

1	SEC PRC DIPLOMATIC RESOURCES REPORT.
2	(a) Sense of Congress.—It is the sense of Con-
3	gress that—
4	(1) the United States is in strategic competition
5	with the People's Republic of China (PRC) that is
6	global in scope;
7	(2) the PRC is the only country with both the
8	intent to reshape the international order and the
9	economic, diplomatic, military, and technological
10	power to do so;
11	(3) the PRC is increasingly assertive abroad,
12	often relying on transnational repression, economic
13	coercion, financial diplomacy, elite capture, lawfare
14	(including outright breaches of established norms
15	and customs) and other malicious tactics to advance
16	its national interests;
17	(4) the PRC is investing significant resources
18	to expand its diplomatic footprint and activities
19	abroad, including in Europe, Africa, and the West-

1	ern Hemisphere, in order to enhance its diplomatic
2	relationships and influence;
3	(5) the United States must maintain a robust
4	diplomatic presence across all regions of the world to
5	effectively compete with the PRC; and
6	(6) the United States must properly resource
7	its diplomatic missions abroad to succeed in pro-
8	longed strategic competition with the PRC.
9	(b) Report.—.Not later than 180 days after the
10	date of the enactment of this Act, and annually thereafter
11	for 10 years, the Secretary shall submit to the appropriate
12	congressional committees a report that details both United
13	States and PRC diplomatic resources and the current and
14	probable future course of PRC diplomatic engagements,
15	and includes—
16	(1) a table of the PRC budget for diplomacy
17	and diplomatic activities for the current and prior
18	year;
19	(2) a list of the locations of PRC diplomatic fa-
20	cilities organized by country and city;
21	(3) the number of staff (PRC and non-PRC)
22	working in each facility in the current and prior
23	year;
24	(4) a list of the locations of United States dip-
25	lomatic facilities organized by country and city;

1	(5) the number of staff (United States and non-
2	United States) working in each facility in the cur-
3	rent and prior year;
4	(6) an assessment of the PRC's priorities and
5	plans for its diplomatic engagements and footprint
6	based on its foreign policy strategies, national budg-
7	et, bilateral agreements to establish or expand diplo-
8	matic facilities, or applicable construction projects;
9	and
10	(7) an identification of priority nations or mul-
11	tilateral institutions where the gap between PRC
12	and United States resources and staffing is imped-
13	ing the advancement of United States interests.
14	(c) FORM; Publication.—The report required by
15	subsection (b) shall be submitted in unclassified form and
