AMENDMENT TO H.R. 5300

OFFERED BY MR. CASTRO OF TEXAS

At the appropriate place in the bill, insert the following:

SEC. _. REVIEW AND REPORT ON SUPPORT FOR UNITED STATES CITIZEN MINOR CHILDREN IN FOREIGN COUNTRIES.

- (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall conduct a review of the conditions faced by United States citizen minor children living abroad after the deportation from the United States of one or both parents.
- (b) SCOPE OF REVIEW.—The review required by subsection (a) shall take into account the following:
 - (1) Number of affected children, including an estimate of how many United States citizen minors are residing outside the United States due to a parent's deportation.
 - (2) Living conditions, including access to housing, education, health care, food security, and other basic needs in host countries.
 - (3) Safety and security, including exposure to violence, exploitation, or child labor in host countries.
 - (4) Psychological and social impacts, including effects of family separation, trauma, and barriers to reintegration if children attempt to return to the United States.
 - (5) Legal status abroad, including whether children have access to citizenship, residency, or services in their country of residence, or whether they are effectively stateless.
 - (6) Consular support, including actions taken by United States embassies and consulates to provide protection, services, or assistance to children.

- (c) REPORT.—Not later than one year after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary shall submit to the appropriate congressional committees a report that contains—
 - (1) the contents of the review required by subsection (a); and
 - (2) recommendations on actions that can be taken to support United States citizen minor children described in the review.
