AMENDMENT TO H.R. 5300

OFFERED BY MR. CASTRO OF TEXAS

After section 320, insert the following:

SEC. 320A. REPORTING ON DEMOCRACY FUND REDUCTIONS IN CUBA, VENEZUELA AND NICARAGUA.

- (a) SENSE OF CONGRESS.—It is the sense of Congress that—
- (1) the promotion of democracy, human rights, and civil society abroad is a core element of United States foreign policy, including in the Western Hemisphere;
- (2) any reduction in funding for democracy programs in Cuba, Venezuela, and Nicaragua may undermine U.S. efforts to support civil society, independent media, and democratic institutions in those countries; and
- (3) the United States Agency for International Development (USAID) administered funds related to democracy and governance programs in Cuba, Venezuela, and Nicaragua.
- (b) REPORT.—Not later than 120 days after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary shall submit to the appropriate congressional committees a report containing the following:
 - (1) A detailed accounting of all Democracy Fund allocations to Cuba, Venezuela, and Nicaragua for the past three fiscal years, including any reductions associated with changes to USAID programs or structure.
 - (2) Identification of specific programs or initiatives in each country that have been curtailed, reduced, or eliminated as a result of funding cuts or USAID restructuring.
 - (3) Assessment of the potential impact of these reductions on democratic institutions, civil society organizations, independent media, and human rights advocacy in each country.

- (4) Recommendations on steps the Department could take to mitigate the effects of such funding reductions on democracy promotion in these countries.
- (c) FORM.—The report required by subsection (b) shall be submitted in unclassified form, but may include a classified annex if necessary.
- (d) DEFINITION.—In this section, the term "Democracy Fund" means funds appropriated to the Department for programs supporting democracy, governance, civil society, and human rights abroad.
