At the appropriate place, insert the following:

1	SEC HUMANITARIAN THEFT ENFORCEMENT.
2	(a) Liability.—Notwithstanding any other provision
3	or rule of law, any foreign person or entity responsible
4	for the unauthorized diversion or destruction of United
5	States humanitarian assistance, or humanitarian assist-
6	ance funded by the United States that is provided by an
7	international organization, is liable to the United States
8	for the value of such assistance: Provided, That the Sec-
9	retary of State, or the Secretary's designee, shall have sole
10	discretion to determine whether a foreign person or entity
11	is responsible for such diversion or destruction and the
12	value of such assistance under this section.
13	(b) Recovery.—Where the Secretary of State deter-
14	mines that a foreign person or entity is responsible for
15	the unauthorized diversion or destruction of such assist-
16	ance, the Secretary of State should take appropriate steps
17	to recover the value of such assistance from the foreign
18	person or entity.
19	(c) Crediting of Funds.—Notwithstanding any
20	other provision of law, any funds received by the Depart-

- 2 to an appropriate account of the Department of State,
- 3 which shall remain available until expended: Provided,
- 4 That the Secretary of State may transfer such funds to
- 5 an appropriate account of another United States Govern-

- 8 (d) Waiver.—The Secretary of State may waive any
- 9 liability incurred pursuant to subsection (a) if the Sec-
- 10 retary determines that such a waiver is in the national
