

Murray Hiebert

Murray Hiebert serves as senior fellow and deputy director of the Sumitro Chair for Southeast Asia Studies at the Center for Strategic and International Studies (CSIS) in Washington, D.C.

Prior to joining CSIS, Hiebert was senior director for Southeast Asia at the U.S. Chamber of Commerce, where he worked to promote trade and investment opportunities between the United States and Asia. Earlier he worked as a journalist in the *Wall Street Journal's* China bureau, where he covered trade and China's accession to the World Trade Organization. Prior to his posting to Beijing, he worked for the *Wall Street Journal Asia* and the *Far Eastern Economic Review* in Washington, reporting on U.S.-Asia relations.

From 1995 to 1999, Hiebert was based in Kuala Lumpur for the *Review* and covered the Asian financial crisis and developments in Singapore. He was based in Hanoi from 1990 to 1994 for the *Review*, reporting on Vietnam's economic reforms. He joined the *Review's* Bangkok bureau in 1986, covering political and economic developments in Vietnam, Cambodia, and Laos. Hiebert is the author of two books on Vietnam, including *Chasing the Tigers* (Kodansha, 1996).
