

Richard J. Ellings is President of The National Bureau of Asian Research (NBR) and Affiliate Professor of International Studies at the Henry M. Jackson School of International Studies, University of Washington. NBR is a nonprofit, nonpartisan institution whose mission is to inform and strengthen policy in the Asia-Pacific, with offices in Seattle and Washington, DC and operations world-wide.

Prior to co-founding NBR, Dr. Ellings was Assistant Director and on the faculty of the Jackson School, and served as Legislative Assistant for United States Senator Slade Gorton. He is the author of *Embargoes and World Power: Lessons from American Foreign Policy*, editor and author of five books on the Asia Pacific, and co-author of *Private Property and National Security*. He founded the journal *Asia Policy* and the Strategic Asia program, which produces an annual volume assessing the Asian strategic environment from the vantage point of United States interests. Dr. Ellings has served as consultant to the Office of the Secretary of Defense, Department of State, Department of Energy, and U.S. Information Agency.

He earned his B.A. from the University of California, Berkeley and M.A. and Ph.D. from the University of Washington, where he specialized in international relations, Chinese politics, and American foreign policy. He received the University of Washington's Distinguished Teaching Award.
