Andrea Gittleman is a program manager for the Simon-Skjoldt Center for the Prevention of Genocide. Previously she was interim director of US policy and senior legislative counsel at Physicians for Human Rights where she designed advocacy and policy strategies on a broad range of international human rights issues, including mass atrocities. Prior to that she served as an Arthur Helton Global Human Rights Fellow with the Burma Lawyers' Council in Mae Sot, Thailand, where she coordinated an international advocacy campaign for criminal accountability in Burma. She also worked with the New York University Immigrant Rights Clinic as a law student and has had legal internships with Legal Momentum (the Women's Legal Defense and Education Fund), the New York Civil Liberties Union's Reproductive Rights Project, and Human Rights Watch's Women's Rights Division. Prior to attending law school she served as a Peace Corps volunteer in Mauritania where she managed gender and development programs. She received a JD from the New York University School of Law and a BA in political science and international studies from the University of Chicago.
