Dr. Daniel Twining joined IRI as president in September 2017, where he leads the Institute's mission to advance democracy and freedom around the world. Previously, he served as counselor to the president and director of the Asia Program at The German Marshall Fund of the United States, based in Washington, DC. He holds a BA with highest distinction from the University of Virginia and MPhil & DPhil degrees from Oxford University, where he was the Fulbright/Oxford Scholar from 2004-07. He has been a columnist for Foreign Policy and Nikkei and has lived in Asia, Africa, Latin America, and Europe.
