

Matt Ferchen is the Head of Global China Research at the Mercator Institute for China Studies (MERICS). His research focuses on China's economic statecraft, China's developing country relations with Southeast Asia, Latin America and Africa, including the Belt and Road Initiative (BRI), and on the role of China in Transatlantic relations. He specializes in connections between China's domestic and foreign political economy, the governance of China's informal economy, and the relationship between economic development and security in China's foreign policy.

From 2008 to 2017 Ferchen was a faculty member in the Department of International Relations at Tsinghua University and from 2011 to 2019 he was a scholar at the Carnegie-Tsinghua Center for Global Policy, where he directed the China and the Developing World program. He was a Harry S. Truman, Boren, and Fulbright-Hays fellow and holds an MA from John Hopkins SAIS and a PhD from Cornell University.
