Miriam Fullah is the protection manager for World Hope International's Anti-Trafficking and Gender-Based Violence Program in Sierra Leone. She helps families and communities support recovering trauma survivors. A psychosocial counselor, Fullah has served five organizations in Sierra Leone over 16 years, including World Hope for 11 years. Her recounting of survivors' stories shows families, communities and government leaders how mental health affects us all. Fullah informs communities so they can create policies that protect people at risk. Fullah is an expert on protection issues and how families can care for reintegrated survivors. Her recent work includes speaking at the Sierra Leone Mental Health Conference, an event held in conjunction with the UN Commission on the Status of Women, and the first ECOWAS (Economic Community of West African States) Anti-Trafficking Conference.
