Elizabeth (Beth) Hogan is currently the Acting Assistant Administrator for the U.S. Agency for International Development’s Bureau for Latin America and the Caribbean and has served as the Senior Deputy Assistant Administrator for the Bureau for Latin America and the Caribbean since 2012. Previously, she served as the Director of the Agency’s Haiti Task Team, overseeing reconstruction efforts after the 2010 earthquake. Hogan has also served with USAID in Washington, D.C., as Executive Director of the Advisory Committee on Voluntary Foreign Aid, Director of South American Affairs, and Director of the Development Education Grants Program.

Hogan is a member of the senior Foreign Service with over 25 years of development experience in Latin America (Guatemala and Jamaica), Africa (Cote d’Ivoire and South Africa) and Asia (India). She has also served as the Senior Development Counselor to the Ambassador of the U.S. Permanent Mission to the United Nations in Geneva.

Hogan holds a Master’s Degree in international public policy from Johns Hopkins University’s School of Advanced International Studies and a Master’s in national security policy from the National War College.
