



Fernando Menéndez, an economist and political analyst, is SFS's Senior Fellow for Strategic Initiatives. He is the co-author, with SFS executive director Joseph Humire and Canadian scholar Victoria Henderson, of "Canada on Guard: Assessing the Immigration Security Threat of Iran, Venezuela and Cuba" and "A Nuclear Latin America?" in *Defense Dossier* (American Foreign Policy Council).

Menéndez is a well-known scholar and analyst of Latin American populist movements, Cuba's economic and political history and Cuba-U.S. relations. He is an expert in the emergence and growing economic and political penetration of China in Latin America. He writes a regular column for *China-US Focus*.

During a career as a consultant to institutions and corporations, he earned a *magna cum laude* degree in economics and philosophy from George Mason University, focused on the Hayekian concept of the "second hand dealer in ideas," and was awarded with a Graduate of the Decade Award by the College of Humanities. He has also been cited by clients and learning organizations for his excellence in training and organizational development for over twenty years.

Mr. Menéndez's work has appeared in *The Hill*, *Fox News Latino*, *The Commentator*, *Trending Central* and *Breitbart London*. He has also appeared as a political commentator on Colombia's *NTN24* television network, as well as CTV (Canada), and the Voice of America's *Foro International*.

He is principal of the Cordoba Group International, a strategic consulting firm and has lectured at the American University in Washington, D.C., and the Francisco Marroquín University in Guatemala among other centers of learning.
