Her articles have been published in the Financial Times, Foreign Policy, the Miami Herald, Houston Chronicle, the Harvard Review of Latin America and Foreign Affairs. Ms. Viscidi frequently presents at conferences throughout the United States and Latin America and has been quoted by the Wall Street Journal, Bloomberg, Reuters, and other news outlets.

Previously, she was New York bureau chief and Latin America team leader for Energy Intelligence Group and a manager for Deloitte's energy practice. She has also served as director of EntreMundos, a nonprofit organization based in Quetzaltenango, Guatemala.
