

Duncan Wood, Director, Mexico Institute, Wilson Center



Duncan Wood is the director of the Mexico Institute at the Wilson Center. Prior to this, he was a professor and the director of the International Relations Program at the Instituto Tecnológico Autónomo de México (ITAM) in Mexico City for 17 years. He has been a member of the Mexican National Research System, an editorial advisor to both *Reforma* and *El Universal* newspapers, and is a member of the editorial board of *Foreign Affairs Latinoamérica*. In 2007, he was a non-resident Fulbright Fellow and, between 2007 and 2009, he was technical secretary of the Red Mexicana de Energía, a group of experts in the area of energy policy in Mexico. He has been a Senior Associate with the Simon Chair and the Americas Program at the Center for Strategic and International Studies (CSIS) in Washington, D.C. His research focuses on Mexican energy policy, including renewable energy, and North American relations. He studied in the UK and Canada, receiving his PhD in political studies from Queen's University, Canada, and is a recipient of the Canadian Governor General's Visit Award for contributions to the Mexico-Canada relationship.
