Richard H. Glenn, Deputy Assistant Secretary of INL



Richard H. Glenn is Deputy Assistant Secretary at the Bureau of International Narcotics and Law Enforcement Affairs (INL). In this role, Mr. Glenn oversees INL's Office of Anti-Crime Programs and the Bureau's foreign assistance programs in the Western Hemisphere which support the rule of law as well as law enforcement abroad in combatting illicit drugs and organized crime. INL's Western Hemisphere Programs comprise an annual appropriation of more than \$500 million with programs in more than 20 countries administered by more than 1,000 employees and contractors. INL/C administers assistance programs around the globe and determines policy focused on countering transnational organized crime, cybercrime, illicit finance, alien smuggling, and corruption. In addition to his responsibilities in the Western

Hemisphere, Mr. Glenn oversees five International Law Enforcement Academies in Bangkok, Budapest, Gaborone, San Salvador, and Roswell.

Mr. Glenn began his career at the State Department in 1999 as a Foreign Service Officer. Since joining the State Department, Mr. Glenn has served in Ecuador (2000-2002), South Africa (2002-2004), the Czech Republic (2005-2008), Argentina (2008-2011), and Mexico (2011-2015). In 2011, Mr. Glenn began working with INL in Mexico City implementing the U.S. Government's marquee security assistance program, the Merida Initiative. He previously served as the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary and Office Director for Western Hemisphere Programs from July 2015 until his current appointment began in August 2018.
