

Enrique Roig serves as Vice President of External Affairs at Human Rights First where he leads efforts to build partnerships, shape external engagement, and amplify the voices of human rights defenders in the United States and around the world.

Previously, Enrique served as Director of Policy and Strategic Initiatives at the Seattle International Foundation (SIF) and held senior leadership roles at the U.S. Department of State, including Deputy Assistant Secretary in the Bureau of Democracy, Human Rights, and Labor (DRL), where he led policy on the Western Hemisphere and Africa, and as Senior Advisor to the Under Secretary for Civilian Security, Democracy, and Human Rights. His public service spans complex diplomacy and global engagement across 40 countries in Latin America, Africa, Eastern Europe, and the Caucasus.

At USAID, Enrique served as Coordinator for the Central America Regional Security Initiative (CARS), where he spearheaded innovative, community-based approaches to violence prevention and received four USAID awards for outstanding leadership.

He is also a frequent voice in the media, contributing to platforms such as CNN, BBC, Univision, Telemundo, DW, and NewsNation.

Enrique holds an M.A. in International Relations from American University.
