

Syria:

Humanitarian Assistance (Non-food items), USAID/Office of Foreign Disaster Assistance, \$22,986,937 (includes two extension grants)

Food Assistance to Syrian Displaced (FASD), USAID/Food for Peace, \$40,154, 737 (includes two extension grants. Note that the anticipated amount of the second extension - \$16, 198,344 - is represented here in the total, but is in the process of being formally finalized through a grant agreement with the donor)

Bakery Relief and Enhanced Food Access for the Displaced (BREAD), USAID/Food for Peace, \$30,156,349 (includes two extension grants)

Emergency Hygiene and NFI Distribution and WASH Service Provision in Central/South Syria, USAID/Office of Foreign Disaster Assistance, \$7,000,000 (Administered from Damascus)

Assistance to Iraqi Refugees in Syria, Department of State/Bureau of Population, Refugees and Migration, \$2,000,000
