



David Schenker is the Aufzien fellow and director of the Program on Arab Politics at The Washington Institute for Near East Policy. Previously, he served in the Office of the Secretary of Defense as Levant country director. He was awarded the OSD Medal for Exceptional Civilian Service in 2005. Mr. Schenker is author of two books: [Palestinian Democracy and Governance](#) (2001), and [Dancing with Saddam](#) (2003), a study about Jordanian-Iraqi relations. Additionally, he penned a chapter on US-Lebanese relations published in [Lebanon: Liberation, Conflict, and Crisis](#) (2009), and authored [Egypt's Enduring Challenges](#) (2011), a monograph focusing on post-Mubarak Egypt, and [Political Instability in Jordan](#) (with Robert Satloff), a CFR Contingency Planning Memorandum (2013). Mr. Schenker's writings on Arab affairs have also appeared in a number of prominent scholarly journals and newspapers, including *The Wall Street Journal*, *The Los Angeles Times*, *Politico*, and *The Weekly Standard*. He has an M.A. from the University of Michigan, a Certificate from the Center for Arabic Study Abroad (CASA) at American University in Cairo, and a B.A. from University of Vermont.
