Ben Fishman is a Senior Fellow at The Washington Institute for Near East Policy and an adjunct assistant professor of security studies at Georgetown University. He served from 2009 to 2013 on the National Security Council, where he held several posts, including as executive assistant to Ambassador Dennis Ross; director for Libya, where he coordinated the U.S. support for Libya's revolution and subsequent transition; and as director for North Africa and Jordan where he helped manage the \$1 billion assistance portfolio to Jordan and President Obama's 2013 trip to the Hashemite Kingdom. Since leaving government, he was a consulting senior fellow at the International Institute for Strategic Studies, where he edited *North Africa in Transition: the Struggle for Democracies and Institutions*, and an adjunct defense policy analyst at the RAND Corporation. His publications have appeared in *The New York Times, Washington Post, Foreign Affairs, Foreign Policy, USA Today, The Hill*, and elsewhere.
