Thomas “Tom” Hill is the senior program officer for North Africa at the U.S. Institute of Peace where since focuses on Tunisia, Libya and Algeria. Prior to joining the Institute in 2018, he was as a visiting fellow at the Brookings Institution where he focused on reforming civilian U.S. foreign policy agencies.

From 2013 to 2017, he was the senior professional staff member with the House Committee on Foreign Affairs majority staff, covering North Africa.

Previous to that, he was a foreign affairs officer in the Bureau of Near Eastern Affairs at the Department of State for nearly 10 years, serving in several domestic and overseas assignments.

Mr. Hill has written extensively about ways to modernize the Department of State for the FixGov blog and The Hill and appeared on Al Jazeera, the BBC, and Federal News Radio. He has completed coursework towards a Ph.D. in political science at George Washington University, holds a Master’s Degree in International Peace and Conflict Resolution Studies from American University and a Bachelor’s Degree from Santa Clara University.
