Amanda Catanzano is the Senior Director for International Programs Policy and Advocacy at the International Rescue Committee, where she focuses on the IRC's country-level operational barriers and the challenges faced by the people they seek to assist. She leads the IRC's policy development and advocacy focused on raising the profile of global humanitarian needs, protecting humanitarian access in conflict settings, and promoting fidelity to international humanitarian law and demanding accountability for those who violate it.

Ms. Catanzano comes to the IRC from a career in the U.S. government, most recently as the director for strategic planning at the National Security Council. Prior to the National Security Council, Ms. Catanzano was a member of the Secretary of State's Policy Planning staff and special assistant to the Deputy Secretary of State, covering South and Central Asia with a focus on Afghanistan and Pakistan. She has served in leadership roles in the private sector including at Booz Allen.

Ms. Catanzano holds an MA in American Foreign Policy from the Johns Hopkins School of Advanced International Studies and a BA in International Relations from the Johns Hopkins University.
