Meredith Mishkin Rothbart is the Founder and CEO of Amal-Tikva, a collaborative initiative that brings together philanthropists, field experts, organizations and activists to support civil society peacebuilding between Israelis and Palestinians. She authored the April 2020 report, "The State of Cross-Border Peacebuilding Efforts: Needs Assessment on Israeli and Palestinian Civil Society Organizations." The report, based on interviews with 54 peacebuilding NGOs, maps the challenges and needs of the peacebuilding field, providing concrete and easily implementable recommendations for building a sustainable, resilient and scalable field in its place. Additionally, the report redefines peacebuilding in light of dim prospects for a near-term diplomatic resolution of the Israeli-Palestinian conflict as "working to create a more peaceful reality for Palestinians and Israelis, defined by less hatred, tension, and violence, b) increased quality of life, and c) improved systems for interaction."

Meredith founded Amal-Tikva in order to address the gaps in civil society peacebuilding work at the level of NGOs and meanwhile engage other stakeholders in the process of building a more robust field of civil society peacebuilding. In her role as CEO at Amal-Tikva, Meredith has led strategic planning processes for over a dozen NGOs and is currently co-authoring a strategic planning guidebook that aims to standardize monitoring and evaluation language and tools for peacebuilding initiatives in the Israeli-Palestinian context.

Meredith was the Director of Kids4Peace Jerusalem from 2017 to 2019. She holds an MA in Community Development from Hebrew University and a BA in Politics, Philosophy, Economics from the University of Pittsburgh. Meredith serves on several advisory boards and was founding curator for the Jerusalem Global Shapers Hub of the World Economic Forum. In the moments when she's not pursuing peace in the Middle East, you can find Meredith at the playground near her Jerusalem home chasing her adorable children.
