

Dr. Hanna Notte

Dr. Hanna Notte is a Senior Research Associate with the Vienna Center for Disarmament and Non-Proliferation (VCDNP), focusing on arms control and security issues involving Russia, the Middle East, their intersection, and implications for US and European policy. Prior to that, she was a Senior Political Officer with The Shaikh Group (TSG), a European NGO focused on track two mediation and informal diplomacy in the Middle East. Dr. Notte advised TSG senior leadership on outreach to, and consultations with Russia. She completed her doctorate at Oxford University in 2018 on the topic of US-Russian cooperation in the Middle East. Dr. Notte was a visiting researcher in 2015–16 with the Institute of Oriental Studies of the Russian Academy of Sciences and the Carnegie Moscow Center in Moscow, Russia. Other visiting research positions have included the Konrad-Adenauer-Foundation's Syria/Iraq office in Beirut, Lebanon and the International Institute for Strategic Studies Middle East office in Manama, Bahrain. Her contributions have appeared in *The Nonproliferation Review*, *Foreign Policy*, *The Washington Post*, *The National Interest*, *War on the Rocks* and *Carnegie*, among others.

Her research interests focus on Russia-West relations, Russian foreign policy in the Middle East, Russian military innovation, challenges to the Chemical Weapons Convention, and broader arms control and security issues in the Middle East. Dr. Notte obtained a BA in Social and Political Sciences from Cambridge University in 2010, an MPhil in International Relations from Oxford University in 2014, and spent two years as a Research Analyst at Goldman Sachs' London offices. Fluent in Russian and Arabic, she is a German national residing in Berlin/Vienna.
