



Bio: Mr. Asher Fredman

Asher Fredman is the Executive Director of the Misgav Institute for National Security, and a Visiting Fellow at The Heritage Foundation. His work focuses on the Abraham Accords and regional cooperation, U.S.-Israel relations, international organizations, and Israel's national security strategy.

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Mr. Fredman served from 2021 to 2025 as Director for Israel of the Abraham Accords Peace Institute. He also founded the Israeli-Emirati Forum, was a Founding Member of the UAE-Israel Business Council, and served as a Strategic Advisor to the UAE-IL Tech Zone.

He has authored or co-authored numerous studies on topics such as the India-Middle East-Europe Economic Corridor, Abraham Accords trends, opportunities, and challenges, the impact of the United Nations on the United States and Israel, and the future of the U.S.-Israel alliance. His writings and interviews have appeared in numerous leading American, Israeli, and Middle Eastern outlets. He has been recognized by the Jerusalem Post as one of the top 25 Young Visionaries (2023) and received the 2022 Nefesh B'Nefesh Bonei Zion Young Leadership Prize.

Mr. Fredman served from 2010 to 2019 in various senior roles in Israel's Prime Minister's Office, Ministry of Strategic Affairs, and Ministry of Public Security, where he focused on Israel's strategic communications, international relations, and counter-terror cooperation.

Originally from New York, Mr. Fredman holds a BA and MA from Harvard University in Government and Middle Eastern Studies. He lives with his family in Jerusalem.
