

## **Maura Moynihan**

In 1973 Maura Moynihan moved to New Delhi when her late father, Senator Daniel Patrick Moynihan, served as the United States Ambassador to India. She has worked for many years on issues related to the Chinese Communist occupation of Tibet, as a journalist and researcher. From 1998 to 2002 she established and supervised Radio Free Asia's Tibet service bureau in Kathmandu, Nepal. She has consulted with Refugees International, The International Rescue Committee and other NGO's about Tibet.

Ms. Moynihan worked on all four of her father's senate campaigns. Senator Moynihan served the people of New York in the United States Senate for 24 years, from 1976 until his retirement from public service in 2000. From 2003 to 2008 she was the director of Friends of Moynihan Station and worked on the acclaimed 2004 exhibition "New York's Moynihan" at the Museum of the City of New York. From 1994-5 Ms. Moynihan was a communications consultant at the United States Holocaust Memorial Museum.

Ms. Moynihan obtained a bachelor's degree Harvard University and a Masters of Science from the New School in 2008. She speaks Hindi, Urdu, Tibetan and French. She is a bestselling author of two works of fiction, has exhibited her paintings in gallery shows in India, Nepal and the USA.
