

### **Dr. Amanda E. Wooden**

Dr. Amanda E. Wooden is an Associate Professor and director of the Environmental Studies Program at Bucknell University, Pennsylvania (US). She earned her Ph.D. in International Relations and Public Policy at Claremont Graduate University and her B.A. in Russian and Political Science at Syracuse University. Her dissertation concerned the Aral Sea crisis and Central Asian water politics. In 2006-07, Dr. Wooden served as Organization for Security and Cooperation in Europe (OSCE) Economic and Environmental Officer for the Osh, Kyrgyzstan field office and in 2001 taught at the American University in Central Asia. Dr. Wooden's research focuses on water politics and conflict, environmental protests, public opinion, nationalism, and the water-energy nexus.
