Alan Makovsky is a Senior Fellow at the Center for American Progress, a private think-tank in Washington, DC. From 2001 to 2013, he served as a Senior Professional Staff Member (Democrat) on the Committee on Foreign Affairs in the U.S. House of Representatives, where he covered the Middle East, Turkey, and some related issues.

At The Washington Institute for Near East Policy, a private think-tank where he worked from 1994 to 2001, Makovsky wrote widely on various Middle Eastern and Turkish topics. He also founded and directed The Washington Institute's Turkey Research Program.

At the State Department, where he worked from 1983 to 1994, Makovsky variously covered southern European affairs and Middle Eastern affairs for the Bureau of Intelligence and Research. He also served as Political Advisor to Operation Provide Comfort (1992) and as Special Advisor to the Special Middle East Coordinator (1993-94).
