

Ira N. Forman is a Visiting Professor and Senior Fellow at Georgetown University's Center for Jewish Civilization where he has taught courses on contemporary Antisemitism. Since 2018 he has served as Senior Advisor on Antisemitism at Human Rights First. He also is a Senior Fellow at the Moment Institute and he produces Moment Magazine's Anti-Semitism Monitor project.

Mr. Forman was appointed the U.S. State Department's Special Envoy to Monitor and Combat Anti-Semitism (SEAS) on May 20, 2013. He continued in that role until January 2017. He also served for nearly 15 years as the Executive Director of the National Jewish Democratic Council (NJDC). He worked as Legislative Liaison and Political Director for AIPAC from 1977-1981.

Mr. Forman received his B.A. from Harvard University where he graduated Magna Cum Laude in Government. He received his M.B.A. from Stanford University's Graduate School of Business. He co-edited and wrote for the reference book, *Jews In American Politics*. He has written articles on Jewish American engagement with American democracy for the Encyclopedia Judaica and has authored numerous opinion pieces in publications such as the Washington Post, the Atlantic, Newsweek the Jerusalem Post and New York Jewish Week.
