Dr. Matthew Levitt is the Fromer-Wexler Fellow at The Washington Institute for Near East Policy where he directs the Institute's Reinhard Program on Counterterrorism and Intelligence. Previously, Levitt served as Deputy Assistant Secretary for Intelligence and Analysis at the U.S. Department of the Treasury and before that as an FBI counterterrorism analyst, including work on the Millennial and September 11<sup>th</sup> plots. He also served as a State Department counterterrorism advisor to Gen James L. Jones, the special envoy for Middle East regional security.

Levitt teaches at Georgetown University's School of Foreign Service and Center for Jewish Civilization and has previously taught at Johns Hopkins University's Paul H. Nitze School of Advanced International Studies. He is a life member of the Council on Foreign Relations and sits on the advisory boards of several think tanks around the world. Widely published, Levitt is the author of *Hezbollah: The Global Footprint of Lebanon's Party of God* (Georgetown, 2013), the creator of the *Lebanese Hezbollah Select Worldwide Activity* interactive map and timeline, and the host of the podcast *Breaking Hezbollah's Golden Rule*. His latest research project maps Iran's external operations.
