

David Albright, a physicist, is founder and President of the non-profit Institute for Science and International Security in Washington, D.C. He has conducted numerous assessments of secret nuclear weapons programs throughout the world and the means proliferant states use to obtain the wherewithal for making nuclear weapons and defeating export controls. During his career, Albright has testified numerous times on nuclear issues before the U.S. Congress and advised numerous governments. He has spoken to many groups, technical workshops and conferences, and trained many government officials in non-proliferation policy making. He has published in the *New York Times*, *the Washington Post*, *the Wall Street Journal*, *the Bulletin of the Atomic Scientists*, *Science*, *Scientific American*, *Science and Global Security Washington Quarterly*, and *Arms Control Today*. The media have frequently cited Albright, and he has appeared often on television and radio. Albright has authored or co-authored nine books, including *Revisiting South Africa's Nuclear Weapons Program*, *Illicit Trade Networks - Connecting the Dots*, *Peddling Peril: How the Secret Nuclear Trade Arms America's Enemies*, *Taiwan's Former Nuclear Weapons Program: Nuclear Weapons On-Demand*, and most recently *Iran's Perilous Pursuit of Nuclear Weapons*.
