Dalibor Rohac is a Senior Fellow at the American Enterprise Institute (AEI), where he studies political economy of the European Union, transatlantic relations, the future of Central and Eastern Europe. He is also a Research Associate at the Wilfried Martens Centre for European Studies in Brussels and a Senior Research Fellow in Politics and International Relations at the University of Buckingham in the UK. He is the author of three books including, most recently, *Governing the EU in an Age of Division* (Edward Elgar Publishing, November 2022). His first book, *Towards an Imperfect Union: A Conservative Case for the EU* (Rowman and Littlefield), was included on *Foreign Affairs* magazine's list of best books of 2016.

Rohac has written about European affairs for *The Washington Post*, *The Wall Street Journal*, *The New York Times*, *The Daily Telegraph*, *Financial Times*, *Foreign Affairs*, and many other outlets. He has provided expert testimony to US Congress' Foreign Affairs Committee, the Helsinki Commission, and published in peer-reviewed journals, and appeared on news outlets including the BBC, NPR, Fox News, among others. He holds a Ph.D. in political economy from King's College London.
