Nile Gardiner is Director of the Margaret Thatcher Center for Freedom, and Bernard and Barbara Lomas Fellow, at The Heritage Foundation. Before joining Heritage, Dr. Gardiner served as a foreign policy aide to Lady Thatcher in her private office in London, assisting her with her final book, *Statecraft: Strategies for a Changing World* and advising her on a number of international issues.

Dr. Gardiner is a leading authority on transatlantic relations, US policy towards Europe, the US/UK Special Relationship, and US and British foreign policy. He received his M.A., M.Phil. and Ph.D. degrees in History from Yale University, and B.A. and M.A. in Modern History from Oxford University. He has testified several times before the United States Congress on foreign policy issues, and served as a foreign policy advisor to three US presidential candidates.

Nile Gardiner has provided analysis of global events for US and international television networks including *Fox News Channel, CNN, MSNBC, CNBC, Fox Business Network, BBC, GB News* and *Sky News*. He is a regular contributor to *The London Telegraph* and his writing has appeared in *The Wall Street Journal, The Times of London, The London Sunday Times, The Daily Mail, The Mail on Sunday, USA Today, The New York Times Room for Debate, The Washington Times, National Review and The Boston Globe.*
