

Luke Coffey is a senior fellow at Hudson Institute focusing on foreign policy issues. Prior to joining Hudson, Mr. Coffey worked at the Heritage Foundation as a research fellow and Director of the Foreign Policy Center. Mr. Coffey previously served at the UK Ministry of Defence as senior special adviser to the British Defence Secretary. He was the first non-UK citizen appointed to this position by the prime minister to provide advice to senior British ministers. He also worked in the House of Commons as an adviser on defense and security issues for the Conservative Party. His work in British politics followed his service to the United States as a commissioned officer in the U.S. Army. He is a veteran of the war in Afghanistan and was awarded the Bronze Star Medal. He holds a masters in science degree in European politics from the London School of Economics.
