Brian Campbell, Director of Policy and Legal Programs

Mr Campbell is responsible for the International Labor Rights Forum's policy, legal and legislative advocacy and directs the ILRF's Campaign to End Child Labor where he works with grassroots partners in Africa and Asia to build their capacity and improve advocacy strategies aimed at ending the root causes of child labor in many different agriculture and industrial sectors, including cotton, cotton seeds, palm oil, tea, tropical fruit and brick kilns, among others. Mr. Campbell has been a leader in the "Cotton Campaign", which is a coalition of over 100 NGOs, trade unions, private foundations, investors, business associations, and individual companies from around the world who have joined forces in a global campaign to end to state-sponsored forced labor in Uzbekistan's cotton industry. He also works closely with NGO partners from Uzbekistan to elevate the role of civil society in the country.

Mr. Campbell received his J.D. from George Washington University Law School and a M.A. in International Development Studies from the George Washington University Elliott School of International Affairs in 2004. Brian is licensed to practice law in the state of Maryland and the District of Columbia.
