

Susan V. Lawrence

Susan V. Lawrence is a Specialist in Asian Affairs at the Congressional Research Service, a unit of the Library of Congress that provides the U.S. Congress with authoritative, non-partisan research and analysis. She covers U.S.-China relations, Chinese foreign policy, Chinese domestic politics, Taiwan, and Mongolia.

Ms. Lawrence joined CRS after a career spent largely in journalism. She worked in Beijing for 11 years, serving as Senior China Correspondent for *The Far Eastern Economic Review*, China Correspondent and Acting Bureau Chief for *The Wall Street Journal*, and Beijing Bureau Chief for *U.S. News & World Report*. She also reported from Washington, D.C. for all three publications. Highlights of her years as a journalist included four sets of in-depth interviews with then-Communist Party General Secretary Jiang Zemin and his senior leadership colleagues over a six-year period in the 1990s. Immediately before joining CRS, Lawrence managed public health advocacy programs in China for a Washington, D.C.-based NGO.

Ms. Lawrence holds an A.B. *magna cum laude* in East Asian Studies from Harvard College and an A.M. in Regional Studies – East Asia from Harvard University. As an undergraduate, she studied in the History Department of Peking University for two years as a Harvard-Yenching Institute Scholar.
