James Pooley provides litigation and management advice in trade secret and patent matters, acting as independent counsel, expert, ADR neutral and special master. He also advises companies and boards regarding information security and risk assessment.

Mr. Pooley recently completed a five-year term as Deputy Director General at the World Intellectual Property Organization in Geneva, where he was responsible for management of the international patent system (PCT). Before his service at WIPO, Mr. Pooley was a successful trial lawyer in Silicon Valley for over 35 years, representing clients in patent, trade secret and technology litigation. He has also taught trade secret law at the University of California, Berkeley, and has served as President of the American Intellectual Property Law Association and of the National Inventors Hall of Fame, where he currently is Chairman of the Board.

Mr. Pooley is an author or co-author of several major works in the IP field, including his treatise *Trade Secrets* (Law Journal Press) and the *Patent Case Management Judicial Guide* (Federal Judicial Center). His recent business book is *Secrets: Managing Information Assets in the Age of Cyberespionage* (Verus Press 2015).

Mr. Pooley graduated from Columbia University Law School as a Harlan Fiske Stone Scholar in 1973, and holds a Bachelor of Arts, with honors, from Lafayette College.
