Aicha Elbasri, a dual Moroccan and American national, was the spokeswoman for the joint African Union-U.N. peacekeeping mission (UNAMID) in Darfur between August 2012 and April 2013. She is the winner of the 2015 Ridenhour Prize for Truth-Telling for blowing the whistle on the U.N. cover-up of atrocities mainly committed by Sudan's government forces, sometimes under U.N. watch.

Between 2000 and 2013, Elbasri held a number of reporting, media and communication positions within the UN system in New York, the Middle East and Africa.

Elbasri holds a PhD in French literature and is a published author. She has contributed articles to various newspapers and magazines in the US, UK, France and the Arab region.
