

Luka Biong Deng Kuol (PhD)

Associate Professor at College of Social and Economic Studies, University of Juba, South Sudan. He is also a Global Fellow at Peace Research Institute Oslo (PRIO) and a fellow at Rift Valley Institute. He was a resident senior fellow at Carr Centre for Human Rights Policy at Harvard Kennedy School and visiting fellow at Institute of Development Studies at University of Sussex, UK. He served as a Director of Centre for Peace and Development Studies at University of Juba, a Minister in the Office of the President of Southern Sudan and a National Minister of Cabinet Affairs of the Sudan until he resigned in May 2011 after Government of Sudan invaded Abyei, his home area. He also worked as a senior economist for the World Bank and a member of teaching staff of Faculty of Economics and Rural Development at Gezira University, Sudan. He received his PhD from the Institute of Development Studies (IDS) at University of Sussex, UK and earned a Master of Arts in Economics (Distinction) and a Master of Business Administration (Distinction) from the Catholic University of Leuven, Belgium and BSc (Honors) from Faculty of Economics and Social Studies at University of Khartoum, Sudan. He has published scholarly articles in a wide array of international journals and contributed with many chapters in various books. He is a recognized expert on the affairs of Sudan and South Sudan in areas of poverty, vulnerability, livelihoods, civil wars, security, peace-building, constitution-making, and state-building.
