

Biography for David Abramowitz

David Abramowitz currently is Managing Director at Humanity United, a foundation that focuses on advancing human freedom by combatting human trafficking and modern slavery, among other human rights issues, and its related organization, Humanity United Action.

Previous to joining Humanity United and Humanity United Action, Mr. Abramowitz served in various positions in the U.S Government for over 20 years. At the Department of State, he served in the Office of the Legal Adviser, working on such issues as arms control, the Middle East Peace Process, and the reorganization of the foreign affairs agencies. In 1999, Mr. Abramowitz joined the staff of the Committee on Foreign Affairs of the House of Representatives and served as Chief Counsel. Over the next ten years, he worked on such legislation as the Victims of Trafficking and Violence Act of 2000 and the William Wilberforce Trafficking Victims Protection Reauthorization Act of 2008, among many others. He was responsible for advising the committee on such matters as international law, international justice, and global human rights and democracy issues.

Mr. Abramowitz graduated from Kalamazoo College with a B.A. and from the University of Michigan Law School with a J.D. Mr. Abramowitz is currently an adjunct professor at Georgetown Law School.
