Maria C. Werlau co-founded in 2002 and still heads the Free Society Project, a non-profit organization to advance human rights through research and scholarship. Its leading initiative, the *Cuba Archive Truth and Memory Project*, focuses on transitional justice issues and human exploitation. Ms. Werlau is a former Second Vice President of Chase Manhattan Bank and a longtime independent consultant specializing in advisories on Cuban affairs and other international issues. Her extensive publications on Cuba cover a wide range of topics including policy, international law, foreign investment and other economic issues. She has served Task Forces on U.S.-Cuba Relations for the Council on Foreign Relations and the American Enterprise Institute. She has a B.S. in Foreign Service from Georgetown University and a Masters in International Affairs from Universidad de Chile.
