Mr. Rasche is counsel with the Chaldean Catholic Archdiocese of Erbil, and Vice Chancellor of External Affairs for the Catholic University in Erbil. In his role with the Archdiocese, Mr. Rasche also serves as the Director of the Nineveh Reconstruction Committee through which he is directly responsible for the humanitarian and resettlement programs for over 10,000 families of displaced Christians in Northern Iraq. In these roles Mr. Rasche divides his time between the U.S., Europe, and Iraq.

Mr. Rasche has over 30 years experience in international business and development projects, including extensive work in Latin America, Asia and the Middle East. Additionally, Mr. Rasche has significant experience in serving as a board member of various non-profit entities. He is a co-founder of the Veterans Law Project of New Hampshire, which provides pro-bono legal aid to returning veterans and their families.
