Bob Fu was a former student leader during the Tiananmen Square democracy movement in 1989. In 1993 he graduated with a law degree on Int'l relations at the Renmin University in Beijing. He was a faculty member in Beijing Party School of the CCP from 1993-1996. He was also a house church leader in Beijing until he and his wife, Bochun "Heidi" Cai, were imprisoned for in 1996. In 1997 he was exiled to US with his family due to President Clinton's intervention. In 2002 he founded China Aid in Philadelphia to promote religious freedom and rule of law in China. He graduated with Ph.D. at St John's College at University of Durham, U.K on the field of religious freedom. His autobiography "God's Double Agent" in 2013 by Baker Publishing Company. Bob regularly testifies and briefs policy makers and legislators on religious freedom and rule of law as well refugee issues in the free world. In 2016 Bob Fu hosted the first ever Asia Pacific Religious Freedom Forum(APRFF.org) along with cohost former Vice President Annette Lu in Taiwan. Bob Fu is a life member of Council on Foreign Relations(CFR) since 2017 and Editor-in-Chief of "Chinese Law and Religion Monitor" journal.
