Dr. Christopher Fomunyoh is the senior associate for Africa and regional director at the National Democratic Institute (NDI). He has led international election observation missions and supervised democracy support programs in numerous African countries. Dr. Fomunyoh works closely with political and civic leaders to advance inclusive democratic progress in the region. He also helped launch the African Statesmen Initiative with former heads of state to facilitate political transitions in Africa. Dr. Fomunyoh is an adjunct faculty at the Africa Center for Strategic Studies and a former adjunct professor of African politics and government at Georgetown University. He also is the founder of a nonprofit organization that supports democracy and humanitarian causes in Cameroon. Dr. Fomunyoh holds a Licence en Droit from Yaoundé University in Cameroon, a master’s degree in international law from Harvard Law School, and a Ph.D. in political science from Boston University. He is fluent in English and French.
