

Mvemba Phezo Dizolele is the Senior Advisor for Africa at the International Republican Institute. Formerly, he was the Peter J. Duignan Distinguished Visiting Fellow and a National Fellow at Stanford University's Hoover Institution on War, Revolution and Peace. He was a grantee of the [Pulitzer Center on Crisis Reporting](#) and covered the 2006 elections in the Democratic Republic of Congo, where he was embedded with United Nations peacekeepers in Ituri district and South Kivu province as a reporter.

A frequent commentator on African affairs, Dizolele has been a guest analyst on PBS's [NewsHour](#) and [Foreign Exchange](#); NPR's [Tell Me More](#) and [Weekend Edition, On Point](#), and the Diane Rehm Show; BBC's World News Update; and Al Jazeera's [The Stream](#), NewsHour, and [Inside Story](#). He has testified before various subcommittees of both chambers of the United States Congress, as well as before the United Nations Security Council.

He is a lecturer in African studies at Johns Hopkins University's School of Advanced International Studies and a non-resident senior associate at the Center for Strategic and International Studies.

He is a veteran of the US Marine Corps Reserve, and he is fluent in several languages, including French, Norwegian, Spanish and Kikongo.
